All Cape Royal Residents Are Invited to Vote and Virtually Attend

## Cape Royal Annual Meeting

Tuesday, February 16, 2021, 7pm

Via [GoToMeeting.com](https://www.gotomeeting.com) from the comfort of your own home

In the interest of keeping our residents safe until a Covid-19 vaccine has made its way through our community, the 2021 Annual Meeting will be held as a virtual meeting with votes mailed or dropped off ahead of time. Under the FL statutes, under "Emergency Bylaws 617.0207," this is a legal practice to ensure the HOA can continue to conduct business in a timely manner. Article 11. Emergency Powers in our Bylaws also refers to the legality of this action.

The meeting will be held via our online gotomeeting.com tool, as has been used for 2020 board meetings. There will be no voice vote or physical counting during the meeting like in the past. Instead, each lot owner will be asked to place their Secret Ballot and Limited Proxy in one of several designated Drop Boxes placed around the community, or mailed in to arrive by Feb. 12<sup>th</sup>. A minimum of 145 Limited Proxies from our 483 lots must be returned in order to hold the annual meeting on February 16<sup>th</sup>.

### Three Important Ways All Residents Need To Be Involved:

- **Week of Jan 25<sup>th</sup>** Annual Meeting packet arrives either by hand-delivery from your Block Captain or via USPS mail. The envelope will contain the following:
  - ◊ **Cover letter and Notice of Annual Meeting** from the HOA Secretary (Karen Durand).
  - ◊ **Secret Ballot with return envelope** to vote for new board members and a copy of each candidate's profile. Note: The secret ballot does not include your name.
  - ◊ **Limited Proxy form with return envelope** that includes a brief explanation of each item before the community to vote with a Yes/No response required **AND** permission for the HOA Secretary to act on your behalf to tally the votes. This form will include your name, address and signature.
  - ◊ **Frequently Asked Question** sheet covering topics such as Limited Proxies, meeting connection, how-to's and possibly more information on items to be voted upon.
- **Jan 26 – Feb 12** - Read and fill out the Secret Ballot and Limited Proxy and either mail them in or drop off at specified Drop Box locations sealed in their specific envelopes throughout the community.
- **Feb 16, 7:00 pm, Attend the Annual Meeting via Gotomeeting.com** (assumes we will have received at least 145 Limited Proxies to hold the meeting)
  - ◊ Hear an overview of our 2020 accomplishments and 2021 plans.
  - ◊ Hear an update from Troon-Green Golf Partners (Troon-GGP) about the Cape Royal Golf Club.
  - ◊ Hear the Limited Proxy vote outcome regarding business before the HOA.
  - ◊ Hear the Secret Ballot outcome and learn the names of the 2 newly elected Board Members.

**Block Captain emails** reminding residents of action needed, meeting agenda and log in information will be sent out between Feb 2<sup>nd</sup> and Feb 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Software needed to join the Annual Meeting** - If a resident has ever attended a board meeting online, they have already downloaded GoToMeeting software on their computer, so will have easy access to the Annual Meeting on Feb 16th. If not, instructions on how to complete this download prior to the Annual Meeting will be included in the FAQ.

**Secret Ballot and Limited Proxy Counts** - We are fortunate that Chuck Hibbert will again lead a group of experienced annual meeting volunteers to tally the Secret Ballots and Limited Proxies. All Secret Ballots and Limited Proxies will be counted prior to the Annual Meeting and communicated to the Secretary so the information is ready to be announced at the Feb. 16<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Please make sure to take care of this important task. We must have a minimum of 145 lots represented in the process to conduct the meeting and count the votes, so every one of you is important.

Reservations are needed for most things, so don't forget to make that call. Some of our HOA Committees and Clubs have started up again, and Josh Ross, our Golf Pro, has lined up some new clinics if you are either new to golf or want to polish up that swing.

The larger sub-project of installing a new wet well liner in the pump house facility, along with a new aquifer pump, went smoothly, albeit a very complicated install that took 3 days. The project team took off from December 21st through January 3<sup>th</sup> to be home for the holidays with their families. Work resumed on January 4<sup>th</sup>.

### Covenant Committee - Parker Cortner

Parker reports that the December Inspection date was cancelled. The **next inspection date planned is February 8th**. He asks for everyone's focus be on completing any issues that came up in the last inspection or that occurred from recent storms.

### Landscape Committee - Lynette Cogan

West Berm irrigation is completed. The annual mulching of the common areas has been approved, which Express Mulch will complete in January.

# HOA Updates

One of our eagle eye residents asked me to share some recent updates and changes that impact our community.



## Waste Pro Services Have Changed

Large items that don't fit into Waste Pro containers will be collected the day after your trash pick up day.

Bulk items should be separated. Piles of items will not be collected and the property owner will be responsible for removal.

Large items can be placed at the curb at the same time as trash and recycling containers. Call Waste Pro to schedule a pick up for white goods (refrigerators, washers, dryers, water heaters, etc.).

Picking up white goods requires a specialized truck. (Note: it has been reported on Nextdoor that you may have to call multiple times).

All items (Trash, Recycling, Large items) for disposal must be at the curb before 6 AM on collection day.

Yard waste must be placed in carts, cans or paper horticulture bags. No plastic bags will be accepted.

## Summary Of Deed Restrictions Updated

An updated summary of the most violated deed restrictions was recently posted on the website and can be found by [Clicking Here](#) and then opening the **Declaration of Covenants Summary** document.

Per HOA legal direction the original Deed of Restrictions document has been retired and replaced with the **AMENDED AND RESTATED DECLARATION OF COVENANTS, CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS ROYAL-TEE HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC.** document also found on this page. The summary document covers the most violated deed restrictions, primarily in the areas of **Article 5: Owner's obligation to Maintain** and **Article 8: USE RESTRICTIONS**.

Please take a moment to review these documents since they are often the basis of what the Covenant's Committee is looking at during major inspections and throughout the year. They serve as a good reminder for all of us, in terms of what we agreed to when we purchased a home in the Cape Royal Community.






## The Holiday Lights Were Spectacular
